1.4	Section 1. EMERGING ADULTHOOD TASK FORCE.			
1.5	Subdivision 1. Creation. (a) The commissioner of human services shall convene an			
1.6	Emerging Adulthood Task Force to study challenges encountered by disconnected youth			
1.7	and to make recommendations to the governor, legislature, and state director to prevent			
1.8	and end homelessness and on interventions, programs, and policies that will support			
1.9	disconnected youth in achieving safety, stability, and opportunity for productive futures.			
1.10	(b) The task force shall be organized according to Minnesota Statutes, section			
1.11	15.059, subdivision 6.			
1.12	Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The task force shall consist of no more than 15 members			
1.13	and shall be chaired by the commissioner of human services. Membership of the task			
1.14	force shall include:

1.16	(2) the commissioner of the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, or designee;
