1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:		
1.6	Section 1. [256B.86] GRANTS FOR LIVING AT HOME PROGRAMS FOR		
	OLDER ADULTS.

1.8	Subdivision 1. Contract. The commissioner shall execute a contract with Living		
1.9	at Home Network for the distribution of grants to establish new and fund existing		
1.10	community-based living at home programs for older adults that enable older adults to live as		
1.11	independently as possible in their homes and communities. This contract shall be executed		
1.12	if Living at Home Network satisfies the requirements in subdivision 2, paragraph (a).		
1.13	Subd. 2. Funding; organizational structure of Living at Home Network. (a)		
1.14	Living at Home Network must be governed by a board of directors, at least 75 percent		
1.15	of which must consist of representatives of programs receiving grants under this section.		
1.16	Other board members may be designated based on their interest or expertise in areas		
1.17	related to the care of older adults. Board members shall not receive compensation except		
1.18	for expenses directly related to serving on the board.		
1.19	(b) Living at Home Network shall be funded at an amount equal to three times the		
1.20	amount of a grant award made to a program per grant period under subdivision 6.		
1.21	Subd. 3. Duties of Living at Home Network. (a) Under the terms of the contract,		
1.22	Living at Home Network shall:		
1.23	(1) distribute grant funds to nonprofit organizations and local units of government to		
1.24	establish new living at home programs and fund existing living at home programs;		

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2.1	(2) evaluate the programs on an ongoing basis to determine whether the goals of the
2.2	nonprofit organization or local unit of government and the program are being met;
2.3	(3) encourage, provide, or recommend coordination and training opportunities for
2.4	program staff and local board members; and
2.5	(4) serve as a liaison between the commissioner and the programs.
2.6	(b) In addition to the duties in paragraph (a), Living at Home Network may:
2.7	(1) coordinate and purchase services such as insurance on behalf of programs;
2.8	(2) charge programs an annual fee to help fund the services Living at Home Network
2.9	provides to programs; and
2.10	(3) charge specific programs additional fees for specialized services Living at Home
2.11	Network provides to the programs.
2.12	Subd. 4. Grant applicants. Nonprofit organizations and local units of government
2.13	are eligible to apply for grants to establish and operate living at home programs for older
2.14	adults. Grant applicants must match at least five percent of the grant funds received with
2.15	funds from community sources.
2.16	Subd. 5. Criteria for programs. A program funded under this section must:
2.17	(1) be located in a community that demonstrates a readiness to establish a community
2.18	model of care and that has formed a board of directors at least two thirds of which is
2.19	comprised of citizens interested in community-based care for older adults;
2.20	(2) be established and operated by a credible, representative nonprofit organization
2.21	within the community or a local unit of government;
2.22	(3) be designed by representatives of the community being served to ensure the
2.23	program addresses the specific needs of community residents;
2.24	(4) provide services within one defined geographic area, have defined staffing and
2.25	organizational structures, and provide for coordinated delivery of services;
2.26	(5) incorporate the basic community, organizational, and service delivery principles
2.27	of the program model;
2.28	(6) provide older adults with a range of services on a sliding fee basis, as an
2.29	alternative to more costly care. These services may include but are not limited to
2.30	information, support services, homemaker services, counseling, training for older adult
2.31	clients and family caregivers, and registered nurse-directed assessment, provision, and
2.32	coordination of health and personal care services;
2.33	(7) emphasize health promotion, early intervention, and management of chronic
2.34	conditions;
2.35	(8) provide services to older adults based on need and not based on ability to pay;

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(9) demonstrate a team a	approach to coordination and management of care, ensuring
that older adults, their families	s, and their providers work together to plan and provide
services;	
(10) recruit, train, and di	irect the use of volunteers to provide informal services and
other support to older adults a	nd their caregivers;
(11) promote joint effort	s to meet the needs of older adults and to increase efficiency
by establishing close ties with	other key neighborhood organizations and groups, including
churches, local units of govern	nment, business groups, block clubs, and other voluntary
organizations;	
(12) provide services wi	thout regard to the religious affiliation of the older adults
served;	
(13) provide assurances	that community resources and funding will be coordinated
and that other funding sources	s will be maximized, including the resources of the older
adults served; and	
(14) regularly evaluate p	program effectiveness and respond to changing community
needs.	
Subd. 6. Grant awards	Grants shall be awarded for four-year periods. The grant
amount for the initial grant pe	riod shall not exceed \$80,000 per applicant. Grant amounts
in subsequent grant periods sh	nall be increased to reflect the cost of living adjustments
given to recipients of Social S	ecurity over the previous four-year grant period. Subject
to availability of funding, gran	nts awarded under this section shall be renewed by Living
at Home Network every four	years, unless Living at Home Network determines that the
grant recipient has not satisfac	ctorily operated the program in compliance with this section
and any guidelines established	d by Living at Home Network.
Subd. 7. Uses of grant	funds. Grant funds may be used for both program
development and the delivery	of services. Grant funds must not be used for religious
activities.	
Subd. 8. Reporting rec	quirements. Living at Home Network shall establish
reporting requirements for nor	nprofit organizations and local units of government receiving
grant funds under this section	and shall, on a periodic basis, submit to the commissioner
data received under this subdi	vision.
