1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to legislative enactments; making miscellaneous technical corrections to
1.3 laws and statutes; correcting obsolete text and references; amending Minnesota
1.4 Statutes 2022, sections 168B.09, subdivision 2; 169.223, subdivision 4; 169.64,
1.5 subdivision 9.

1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 168B.09, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

1.8 Subd. 2. Local laws. Units of government may adopt ordinances and regulations to
1.9 control the matter subject in accordance with to sections 168B.01 to 168B.101, so long as
1.10 the ordinances and regulations are not less stringent than the provisions of sections 168B.01
1.11 to 168B.101 or the rules of the agency.

1.12 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 169.223, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

1.13 Subd. 4. Headlight requirement. The provisions of section 169.974, subdivision 5,
1.14 paragraph (i), apply to motorized bicycles that are equipped with headlights. After June 1,
1.15 1987, A new motorized bicycle sold or offered for sale in Minnesota must be equipped with
1.16 a headlight.

1.17 Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 169.64, subdivision 9, is amended to read:

1.18 Subd. 9. Warning lamp on vehicles collecting solid waste or recycling. A solid waste
1.19 vehicle or recycling vehicle may be equipped with a single amber warning lamp that meets
1.20 the most current Society of Automotive Engineers SAE International standard for authorized
1.21 maintenance and service vehicles, Class 2. The lamp may be operated only when the
1.22 collection vehicle is in the process of collecting solid waste or recycling and is either:

- 2.1 (1) stopped at an establishment where solid waste or recycling is to be collected; or
- 2.2 (2) traveling at a speed that is at least ten miles per hour below the posted speed limit
- 2.3 and moving between establishments where solid waste or recycling is to be collected.
