1.6	Section 1. [290.0684] STUDENT LOAN CREDIT.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms
1.8	have the meanings given.
1.9	(b) "Adjusted gross income" means federal adjusted gross income as defined in
1.10	section 62 of the Internal Revenue Code.
1.11	(c) "Earned income" has the meaning given in section 32(c) of the Internal Revenue
1.12	Code.
1.13	(d) "Eligible individual" means an individual with one or more qualified education
1.14	loans related to an undergraduate or graduate degree program at a postsecondary
1.15	educational institution.
1.16	(e) "Eligible loan payments" means the amount the eligible individual paid during
1.17	the taxable year to pay principal and interest on qualified education loans.
1.18	(f) "Postsecondary educational institution" means a postsecondary institution eligible
