1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. GREEN SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION ADVISORY TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definition. For purposes of this section, "green school" means a
1.7	school that is designed, constructed, and operated to:
1.8	(1) reduce the environmental impact of the school's physical infrastructure and
1.9	operation;
1.10	(2) protect the health of students and staff by minimizing their exposure to harmful
1.11	chemicals; and
1.12	(3) expand student awareness of the workings of the natural environment through
1.13	the curriculum and the design and operation of the school campus.
1.14	Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The commissioners of administration and education shall
1.15	jointly appoint members of the Green School Construction Advisory Task Force as follows:
1.16	(1) one member each from the Departments of Education, Administration, Health,
1.17	and Commerce;
1.18	(2) one member from the Center for Sustainable Building Research at the University
1.19	of Minnesota;
1.20	(3) one member from the U.S. Green Building Council's Minnesota chapter;
