BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. ASIAN-PACIFIC MINNESOTAN WOMEN PROTECTION AND
SUPPORT PROGRAM TASK FORCE.
Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of human services and the
Council on Asian-Pacific Minnesotans shall appoint an advisory task force by June 1, 2014,
to research the existing system of support for Asian-Pacific Minnesotan women and their
children living in vulnerable and dangerous circumstances, the effectiveness of the system
in providing aid to Asian-Pacific Minnesotan women and their children, and any further
improvements of the system to ensure that culturally and linguistically accessible resources
are available and delivered to Asian-Pacific Minnesotan women and their children.
Subd. 2. Duties. The duties of the task force include:
(1) reviewing the state of Asian-Pacific Minnesotan women, especially those who
have limited English proficiency, are recent refugees or immigrants, and are in vulnerable
and dangerous circumstances;
(2) evaluating the effectiveness and accessibility of existing support programs for
Asian-Pacific Minnesotan women;
(3) building on those evaluation findings and recommending possible culturally and
linguistically accessible resources and programs for the women; and
(4) providing estimates of the funds needed for the resources and programs.
