1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 609.78, subdivision 2a, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 2a. Felony offense; reporting fictitious emergency resulting in serious
1.9	injury. Whoever violates subdivision 2, clause (2), is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced
1.10	as follows:
1.11 1.12	(1) to imprisonment for not more than ten years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$20,000, or both, if the call triggers an emergency response and, as a result of the response,
1.13	someone suffers great bodily harm or death-; or
1.14 1.15 1.16	(2) to imprisonment of not more than three years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both, if the call triggers an emergency response and as a result of the response, someone suffers substantial bodily harm.
1.17	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective August 1, 2020, and applies to crimes
1.18	committed on or after that date.
