1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Laws 2015, First Special Session chapter 3, article 2, section 70, subdivision
1.7 26, is amended to read:

1.8 Subd. 26. **Education partnership pilots.** For education partnership pilot grants:

1.13 Of this amount, \$167,000 in each year is for the Northfield Healthy Community
1.14 Initiative for a pilot site in Northfield; \$167,000 in each year is for the Jones Family
1.15 Foundation for a pilot site in Red Wing; \$167,000 in each year is for Independent School
1.16 District No. 535, Rochestor, for a pilot site in Rochestor; and \$167,000 in each year is
1.17 for Independent School District No. 742, St. Cloud, for a pilot site in St. Cloud. Each
1.18 partnership pilot program shall support community collaborations focused on academic
1.19 achievement and youth development, use a comprehensive and data-driven approach to
1.20 increase student success, and measure outcomes, such as kindergarten readiness, reading
1.21 proficiency at third grade, high school graduation, and college and career readiness. ~~By~~
1.22 ~~February 15, 2016,~~ Each partnership pilot grant recipient shall submit to the chairs and
1.23 ranking minority members of the legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over
1.24 kindergarten through grade 12 education a report describing the activities funded by the

2.1 grant, changes in outcome measures attributable to the grant-funded activities, and the
2.2 recipient's program plan for the following year.

2.3 This is a onetime appropriation. Any balance from the first year may carry forward
2.4 into the second year.
