1.10	guest rooms intended or designed to be used, or which are used, rented, or hired out to be
1.11	occupied, or which are occupied for sleeping purposes by guests.

(a) 2.21 In lieu of requirements of subdivision 1, multifamily dwellings may have approved and 2.22 operational carbon monoxide alarms detectors installed between 15 and 25 feet of carbon 2.23 monoxide-producing central fixtures and equipment, provided there is a centralized alarm 2.24 system or other mechanism for responsible parties to hear the alarm at all times. 2.25 (b) An owner of a multifamily dwelling that contains minimal or no sources of carbon 2.26 monoxide may be exempted from the requirements of subdivision 1, provided that such 2.27 owner certifies to the commissioner of public safety that such multifamily dwelling poses 2.28 no foreseeable carbon monoxide risk to the health and safety of the dwelling units. 2.29 (c) The requirements of this section do not apply to facilities owned or operated by the 2.30 state of Minnesota. 2.31
