Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 326B.0981, subdivision 4, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 4. Internet continuing education. (a) The design and delivery of an Internet 17 continuing education course must be approved by the International Distance Education 1.8 Certification Center (IDECC) or the International Association for Continuing Education 1.9 and Training (IACET) before the course is submitted for the commissioner's approval. The 1.10 approval must accompany the course submitted. 1.11 (b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to approval of an Internet continuing education course 1.12 for manufactured home installers. An Internet continuing education course for manufactured 1.13 home installers must be approved by the United States Department of Housing and Urban 1.14 Development or by the commissioner of labor and industry. The approval must accompany 1.15 the course submitted. 1.16 (c) An Internet continuing education course must: 1.17 (1) specify the minimum computer system requirements; 1.18 (2) provide encryption that ensures that all personal information, including the student's 1.19 name, address, and credit card number, cannot be read as it passes across the Internet; 1.20

number or the last four digits of the licensee's or attendee's Social Security number; and
(23) allow the commissioner the ability to electronically review the class to determine
if credit can be approved.

(e) (d) The final examination must be either an encrypted online examination or a paper examination that is monitored by a proctor who certifies that the student took the examination.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.

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
