1.9	"qualifying child" means a child who satisfies both of the following:
1.10	(1) is not a child or dependent of an employee of the child care provider; and
1.11	(2) does not reside with an employee of the child care provider.
1.12	(b) Funds distributed under this chapter must not be paid for child care services
1.13	that are provided for a child by a child care provider who employs either the parent of
1.14	the child or a person who resides with the child, unless at all times at least 50 percent of
1.15	the children for whom the child care provider is providing care are qualifying children
1.16	under paragraph (a).
1.17	(c) If a child care provider satisfies the requirements for payment under paragraph
