1.6	Section 1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED.
1.7	An amendment to the Minnesota Constitution is proposed to the people. If the amendment
1.8	is adopted, article IV, section 17, will read:
1.9	Sec. 17. No law shall embrace more than one subject, which shall be expressed in its
1.10	title. The title of a bill must not be amended after the bill is introduced in the legislature
1.11	unless the title is amended to reflect changes to the bill that further limit the scope of the
1.12	bill. If the supreme court deems a bill constituting a portion of the state biennial budget
1.13	unconstitutional for violating this section, funding for the affected portion of state government
1.14	is available at 95 percent of the previous biennium's funding level until the subsequent law
1.15	is enacted to fund the affected portion of state government.
