Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 144.291, subdivision 2, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 2. Definitions. For the purposes of sections 144.291 to 144.298, the following 1.7 terms have the meanings given. 1.8 (a) "Group purchaser" has the meaning given in section 62J.03, subdivision 6. 1.9

1.10 (b) "Health information exchange" means a legal arrangement between health care

1.11 providers and group purchasers to enable and oversee the business and legal issues

1.12 involved in the electronic exchange of health records between the entities for the delivery

1.13 of patient care.

(c) "Health record" means any information, whether oral or recorded in any form or
medium, that relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of
a patient; the provision of health care to a patient; or the past, present, or future payment
for the provision of health care to a patient.

1.18 (d) "Identifying information" means the patient's name, address, date of birth,

1.19 gender, parent's or guardian's name regardless of the age of the patient, and other

1.20 nonclinical data which can be used to uniquely identify a patient.

(e) "Individually identifiable form" means a form in which the patient is or can beidentified as the subject of the health records.

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(f) "Medical emergency" means medically necessary care which is immediately 2.1 needed to preserve life, prevent serious impairment to bodily functions, organs, or parts, 2.2 or prevent placing the physical or mental health of the patient in serious jeopardy. 2.3 (g) "Patient" means a natural person who has received health care services from a 2.4 provider for treatment or examination of a medical, psychiatric, or mental condition, 2.5 the surviving spouse, surviving adult children, and parents of a deceased patient, or a 2.6 person the patient appoints in writing as a representative, including a health care agent 2.7 acting according to chapter 145C, unless the authority of the agent has been limited by the 2.8 principal in the principal's health care directive. Except for minors who have received 2.9 health care services under sections 144.341 to 144.347, in the case of a minor, patient 2.10 includes a parent or guardian, or a person acting as a parent or guardian in the absence 2.11 of a parent or guardian. 2.12 (h) "Provider" means: 2.13 (1) any person who furnishes health care services and is regulated to furnish the 2.14 services under chapter 147, 147A, 147B, 147C, 147D, 148, 148B, 148C, 148D, 150A, 2.15 151, 153, or 153A; 2.16 (2) a home care provider licensed under section 144A.46; 2.17 (3) a health care facility licensed under this chapter or chapter 144A; 2.18 (4) a physician assistant registered under chapter 147A; and 2.19 (5) an unlicensed mental health practitioner regulated under sections 148B.60 to 2.20 148B.71. 2.21 (i) "Record locator service" means an electronic index of patient identifying 2.22 2.23 information that directs providers in a health information exchange to the location of patient health records held by providers and group purchasers. 2.24 (j) "Related health care entity" means an affiliate, as defined in section 144.6521, 2.25 subdivision 3, paragraph (b), of the provider releasing the health records. 2.26 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment. 2.27

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
