[144.1212] NOTICE TO PATIENT; MAMMOGRAM RESULTS. 1.5 Subdivision 1. **Definition.** For purposes of this section, "facility" has the meaning 1.6 1.7 provided in United States Code, title 42, section 263b(a)(3)(A). Subd. 2. **Required notice.** A facility at which a mammography examination is 18 performed shall, if a patient is categorized by the facility as having heterogeneously 19 dense breasts or extremely dense breasts based on the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data 1 10 System established by the American College of Radiology, include in the summary of the 1 11 written report that is sent to the patient, as required by the federal Mammography Quality 1.12 Standards Act, United States Code, title 42, section 263b, the following notice: 1.13 "Your mammogram shows that your breast tissue is dense. Dense breast tissue is 1 14 relatively common and is found in more than 40 percent of women.
