1.9	Subdivision 1. Payment or rebate of insurance deductible. A residential
1.10	contractor providing residential roofing goods and services to be paid by an insured from
1.11	the proceeds of a property or casualty insurance policy shall not advertise or promise to
1.12	pay or rebate all or part of any applicable insurance deductible, as an inducement to the
1.13	sale or provision of goods or services to an insured, advertise or give directly or indirectly
1.14	to an insured or any other person not in the employ of a residential contractor any: (1)
1.15	rebate, including advertising or promising to pay all or any part of an insurance deductible;
1.16	(2) gift; (3) prize; (4) bonus; (5) coupon; (6) credit; (7) referral fee; (8) trade-in or trade-in
1.17	payment; (9) advertising or other fee or payment; or (10) anything of value whatsoever. If
