1.6	Section 1. [299P.01] DEFINITIONS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Application. As used in this chapter, the following terms have the
1.8	meanings given.
1.9	Subd. 2. Animal. "Animal" has the meaning given in section 343.20, subdivision 2.
1.10	Subd. 3. Animal cruelty. "Animal cruelty" has the meaning given to "cruelty" in section
1.11	<u>343.20</u> , subdivision 3.
1.12	Subd. 4. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of public safety.
1.13	Subd. 5. Director. "Director" means the director of the Office of Animal Protection.
1.14	Subd. 6. Office. "Office" means the Office of Animal Protection.
1.15	Sec. 2. [299P.02] OFFICE OF ANIMAL PROTECTION; CREATION; POWERS
1.16	AND DUTIES; ANNUAL REPORTING.
1.17	Subdivision 1. Creation. The Office of Animal Protection is created within the Bureau
1.18	of Criminal Apprehension of the Department of Public Safety.
1 19	Subd 2 Powers and duties. The office has the following powers and duties:

2.1	(1) it shall seek to promote a comprehensive and measurable approach for the prevention
2.2	of animal cruelty, protection of animals, enforcement of animal cruelty statutes, and education
2.3	across multiple disciplines throughout the state, including but not limited to:
2.4	(i) investigations;
2.5	(ii) prosecution;
2.6	(iii) forensic veterinary medicine;
2.7	(iv) animal care, transport, and housing; and
2.8	(v) human welfare, as it relates to offenders or victims of animal cruelty;
2.9	(2) it shall foster partnerships and collaborations with other criminal justice partners and
2.10	related disciplines, as described in clause (1), items (i) to (v), to identify community and
2.11	enforcement needs and challenges related to the crime of animal cruelty; establish effective
2.12	enforcement practices and initiatives based on these needs; and, if needed, seek changes to
2.13	laws or administrative rules;
2.14	(3) it shall work to build capacity to assist local, state, Tribal, and federal authorities
2.15	and other criminal justice partners in the investigation and prosecution of animal cruelty,
2.16	including providing information, education, advice, training, services, and resources, and
2.17	engaging communities in the prevention of animal cruelty;
2.18	(4) it shall work to provide standards, training, and certification for authorities and
2.19	criminal justice partners in the enforcement of animal cruelty laws;
2.20	(5) it shall work to educate, train, and build public awareness of the importance of the
2.21	humane treatment of animals with the goals of demonstrating why animal cruelty is harmful
2.22	to society and increasing knowledge about how to recognize and report animal cruelty;
2.23	(6) it shall support the advisory committee established in section 299P.03 and coordinate
2.24	the office's mission with the committee's guidance;
2.25	(7) it may conduct case reviews involving the investigation, prosecution, and sentencing
2.26	of selected closed animal cruelty cases and provide feedback to the entities involved;
2.27	(8) it may collect, maintain, analyze, and report on data relating to animal cruelty cases;
2.28	(9) it may conduct and compile research into animal cruelty and publicize the results of
2.29	the research; and
2.30	(10) it may award grants as provided in section 299P.06.

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Subd. 3. Annual performance report. On or before January 15 of each year, the director shall submit an annual report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees having jurisdiction over public safety finance and policy on the office's operations and any recommendations for changes in law relating to animal protection.

## Sec. 3. [299P.03] ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

- Subdivision 1. Advisory committee. The commissioner shall establish and appoint the members of an advisory committee pursuant to section 15.059. The committee shall adopt procedures to govern the committee's conduct as necessary and select a chair from among its members. The committee shall act in an advisory capacity, providing assistance and advice to the office in the development and execution of its duties, including outreach to communities and stakeholders.
- Subd. 2. Committee members. Committee members shall possess knowledge, skills, or experiences in the prevention, investigation, or prosecution of animal cruelty and the care of animals, reflecting the five disciplines described in section 299P.02, subdivision 2, clause (1), items (i) to (v). The committee shall also include members of the public with knowledge of animal law and animal cruelty or experiences with animal cruelty as a victim, including trauma of victims.
- Subd. 3. Subcommittees. The committee may establish subcommittees to identify, discuss, and make recommendations on specific topics related to animal cruelty and effective enforcement efforts of animal cruelty statutes, including but not limited to animal cruelty reporting, victim services, crime data collection, cross-reporting, courtroom advocates, and crime prevention.

## Sec. 4. [299P.04] DIRECTOR; OTHER STAFF.

- (a) The commissioner shall appoint a director for the office. The director shall have qualifications that include or are similar to the following:
- (1) experience or knowledge in criminal law;
- (2) experience or knowledge in the many facets of animal cruelty and the five disciplines
  described in section 299P.02, subdivision 2, clause (1), items (i) to (v), that contribute to
  the protection of animals and humans and successful outcomes; and
- (3) expertise in leadership with planning and communication skills to foster change
  management techniques and define, develop, and implement office priorities, policies, and
  operations.
