- Section 1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED. 1.6
- An amendment to the Minnesota Constitution is proposed to the people. If the amendment 17
- is adopted, a section shall be added to article I, to read: 1.8
- Sec. 18. All persons shall be guaranteed equal rights under the laws of this state. The 1.9
- state shall not discriminate against any person in intent or effect on account of one or more 1.10
- of the following: 1.11
- (a) race; 1.12
