- 1.2 relating to health care; modifying the definition of affordability for families with
- 1.3 access to employer-subsidized insurance for purposes of MinnesotaCare eligibility;
- 1.4 amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256L.07, subdivision 2.
- 1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256L.07, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
- 1.7 Subd. 2. **Must not have access to employer-subsidized minimum essential**
- 1.8 **coverage.** (a) To be eligible, a family or individual must not have access to subsidized health
- 1.9 coverage that is affordable and provides minimum value as defined in Code of Federal
- 1.10 Regulations, title 26, section 1.36B-2.
- 1.11 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), an individual who has access to subsidized health
- 1.12 coverage through a spouse's employer that is deemed minimum essential coverage under
- 1.13 Code of Federal Regulations, title 26, section 1.36B-2, is eligible for MinnesotaCare if the
- 1.14 portion of the annual premium the employee pays for employee and dependent coverage
- 1.15 exceeds the required contribution percentage as described in Code of Federal Regulations,
- 1.16 title 26, section 1.36B-2.
- 1.17 ~~(b)~~ (c) This subdivision does not apply to a family or individual who no longer has
- 1.18 employer-subsidized coverage due to the employer terminating health care coverage as an
- 1.19 employee benefit.
