| 1.9 | (a) The commissioner of management and budget shall coordinate the development of |
| 1.10 | a disparity impact note for any proposed legislation upon request of the chair or ranking |
| 1.11 | minority member of any standing committee if it appears enactment could significantly |
| 1.12 | increase or decrease disparities. Upon receipt of a request to prepare a disparity impact note, |
| 1.13 | the commissioner must notify the authors of the proposed legislation that the request has |
