1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 169.98, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.7	Subdivision 1. Colors and markings. (a) Except as provided in subdivisions 2 and
1.8	2a, all motor vehicles which are primarily used in the enforcement of highway traffic rules
1.9	by the State Patrol or for general uniform patrol assignment by any municipal police
1.10	department or other law enforcement agency, except conservation officers, shall have
1.11	uniform colors and markings as provided in this subdivision. Motor vehicles of:
1.12	(1) municipal police departments, including the University of Minnesota Police
1.13	Department and park police units, shall be predominantly blue, brown, green, black,
1.14	or white;
1.15	(2) the State Patrol shall be predominantly maroon; and
1.16	(3) the county sheriff's office shall be predominantly brown, black, gold, or white.
1.17	(b) The identity of the governmental unit operating the vehicle shall be displayed on
1.18	both front door panels and on the rear of the vehicle. The identity may be in the form of
