1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 290A.03, subdivision 11, is amended to

1.13	of occupancy of the claimant's Minnesota homestead in the calendar year, and which
1.14	rent constitutes the basis, in the succeeding calendar year of a claim for relief under this

lease payments, "property taxes payable" includes the amount of the payments directly 2.1 attributable to the property taxes assessed against the parcel on which the house is located. 2.2 No apportionment or reduction of the "property taxes payable" shall be required for the 2.3 use of a portion of the claimant's homestead for a business purpose if the claimant does not 2.4 deduct any business depreciation expenses for the use of a portion of the homestead in the 2.5 determination of federal adjusted gross income. For homesteads which are manufactured 2.6 homes as defined in section 273.125, subdivision 8, and for homesteads which are park 2.7 trailers taxed as manufactured homes under section 168.012, subdivision 9, "property 2.8 taxes payable" shall also include 17 18 percent of the gross rent paid in the preceding 2.9 year for the site on which the homestead is located. When a homestead is owned by 2.10 two or more persons as joint tenants or tenants in common, such tenants shall determine 2.11 between them which tenant may claim the property taxes payable on the homestead. If 2.12 they are unable to agree, the matter shall be referred to the commissioner of revenue 2.13 whose decision shall be final. Property taxes are considered payable in the year prescribed 2.14 2.15 by law for payment of the taxes.

In the case of a claim relating to "property taxes payable," the claimant must have 2.16 owned and occupied the homestead on January 2 of the year in which the tax is payable 2.17 and (i) the property must have been classified as homestead property pursuant to section 2.18 273.124, on or before December 15 of the assessment year to which the "property taxes 2.19 payable" relate; or (ii) the claimant must provide documentation from the local assessor 2.20 that application for homestead classification has been made on or before December 15 2.21 of the year in which the "property taxes payable" were payable and that the assessor has 2.22 2.23 approved the application.

## 2.24 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective for claims based on rent paid in 2.25 2013 and thereafter.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 290A.04, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
Subd. 2. Homeowners; homestead credit refund. A claimant whose property
taxes payable are in excess of the percentage of the household income stated below shall
pay an amount equal to the percent of income shown for the appropriate household
income level along with the percent to be paid by the claimant of the remaining amount
of property taxes payable. The state refund equals the amount of property taxes payable
that remain, up to the state refund amount shown below.

  4.21 income thresholds and the maximum refunds under subdivisions 2 and 2a for inflation.
  4.22 The commissioner shall make the inflation adjustments in accordance with section 1(f) of
  4.23 the Internal Revenue Code, except that for purposes of this subdivision the percentage
  4.24 increase shall be determined as provided in this subdivision.
- 4.25 (b) In adjusting the dollar amounts of the income thresholds and the maximum
  4.26 refunds under subdivision 2 for inflation, the percentage increase shall be determined
  4.27 from the year ending on June 30, 2011 2013, to the year ending on June 30 of the year
  4.28 preceding that in which the refund is payable.
- 4.29 (c) In adjusting the dollar amounts of the income thresholds and the maximum
  4.30 refunds under subdivision 2a for inflation, the percentage increase shall be determined
  4.31 from the year ending on June 30, 2000, to the year ending on June 30 of the year preceding

- 4.33 (d) The commissioner shall use the appropriate percentage increase to annually
  4.34 adjust the income thresholds and maximum refunds under subdivisions 2 and 2a for
  4.35 inflation without regard to whether or not the income tax brackets are adjusted for inflation
