1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.78, subdivision 2a, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 2a. Felony offense; reporting fictitious emergency resulting in serious
1.9	injury. Whoever violates subdivision 2, clause (2), is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced
1.10	as follows:
1.11	(1) to imprisonment for not more than ten years or to payment of a fine of not more than
1.12	\$20,000, or both, if the call triggers an emergency response and, as a result of the response,
1.13	someone suffers great bodily harm or death-; or
1.14	(2) to imprisonment of not more than three years or to payment of a fine of not more
1.15	than \$10,000, or both, if the call triggers an emergency response and as a result of the
1.16	response, someone suffers substantial bodily harm.
1.17	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2023, and applies to crimes
1.18	committed on or after that date.

- 2.8 (2) a direct victim of the fictitious emergency.
