1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [129E.01] MINNESOTA VOLUNTEERISM INNOVATION BOARD.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Board established; membership. (a) A Minnesota Volunteerism
1.8	Innovation Board is established. The board consists of the following members:
1.9	(1) three members appointed by the governor;
1.10	(2) two members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
1.11	(3) one member appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives;
1.12	(4) two members appointed by the president of the senate; and
1.13	(5) one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate.

Ş	Subd. 7. Expiration. The board expires June 30, 2025.
	Subdivision 1. Grants; measures of progress. The Minnesota Board on Volunteerism
Inno	ovation must administer a grant program intended to increase measurable results of
inno	ovative volunteer efforts aligned with Minnesota Compass measures, or other similar
com	munity indicators, in areas that impact Minnesotans' quality of life. The measures must
serv	e as indicators of progress to be measured in order to determine the recipient's progress
towa	ard identified community goals. An applicant for a grant must identify the measures to
<u>be u</u>	sed when applying for a grant.
5	Subd. 2. Eligibility; nonstate match required. Grants may be awarded to organizations
in th	ne public, nonprofit, or business sector that directly engage primarily nonstipend
volu	inteers. To be eligible for a grant, an applicant must match the grant funds requested to
be a	warded in full. The match may be demonstrated through a direct contribution of funds,
or tł	arough in-kind contributions, including the value of staff and volunteer time provided
by t	he applicant, the applicant's community partners, or other nonstate sources. The value
<u>of ti</u>	me of volunteers who receive a stipend may not be counted toward the match
requ	airement. The value of time of volunteers who receive reimbursement for direct
volu	inteer-related expenses may be counted toward the match requirement. Grants may be
rene	ewed at the discretion of the board.

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Sub	od. 3. Rules and laws governing grantmaking process. The board must adopt
admini	strative rules to establish procedures governing the application for grants, evaluation
of appl	ications, and other requirements for awarding grants, including procedures to ensure
hat gra	ant awards are equitably distributed to applicants in all regions of the state. Sections
6B.97	to 16B.991 apply to the award of grants by the board. The terms of the grant
ıgreem	nent must require that all activities funded by the grant be completed no later than
une 30	0, 2025.
Sub	od. 4. Expiration. This section expires June 30, 2025.

<u>\$60</u>	0,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the volunteerism
nnova	tion account in the special revenue fund established by Minnesota Statutes, section
129E.0	3. Of this amount, no more than \$70,000 may be used to support administrative costs
associa	ted with implementing the requirements of this act. All remaining amounts must be
distribi	ated as grants under Minnesota Statutes, section 129E.02.
