1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 473.859, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.8	to read:
1.9	Subd. 3a. Climate action plan. A climate action plan shall describe how the land use
1.10	plan under subdivision 2 and the public facilities plan under subdivision 3 meet carbon
1.11	reduction goals that may be established by the council in the comprehensive development
1.12	guide for the metropolitan area. The climate action plan must include the following
1.13	information:
1.14	(1) quantitative data for vehicle miles traveled, commute modal share, and transit viability
1.15	anticipated under the transportation plan under subdivision 3, clause (1), and how such data
1.16	affect carbon reduction goals;
1.17	(2) the percentage of energy generated within the jurisdiction of the local governmenta
1.18	<u>unit;</u>
1.19	(3) the percentage of buildings within the jurisdiction of the local governmental unit
1.20	that have eliminated carbon dioxide emissions;
1.21	(4) the percentage of dedicated farmland, open space, and parkland within the jurisdiction
1.22	of the local governmental unit and policies that preserve such land;

(6) any other carbon reduction activiti	ies undertaken by the local governmental unit.
EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION	ON. (a) This section is effective July 1, 2025, and
applies to comprehensive plans submitted	to the Metropolitan Council after that date as part
of the decennial review under Minnesota	Statutes, section 473.864, subdivision 2.
(b) This section applies in the countie	s of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey,
Scott, and Washington.

Subdivision 1. <b>Definitions.</b> The defin	itions provided in Minnesota Statutes, section
473.121, apply to this section.	
Subd. 2. Metropolitan land use stud	y. The Metropolitan Council must conduct and
complete a metropolitan land use and train	nsportation policy study on or before June 30,
.024, that analyzes the degree to which c	urrent land use and transportation policies in the
netropolitan area support or hinder state	and local governmental unit transportation,
nvironmental, and equity goals. The stud	y must be used to inform the 2050 comprehensive
levelopment guide for the metropolitan a	area.
Subd. 3. Study contents. The study u	nder this section must include:
(1) a comparison of current land use p	policies in the metropolitan area with alternative
growth development scenarios, including	efficient land use and compact growth;
(2) a determination of the costs to loca	al and regional metropolitan area government
ervices to implement efficient land use po	licies, including the costs to construct and maintain
ransportation and water infrastructure an	d emergency services;
(3) an assessment of transportation an	d related infrastructure necessary to facilitate
fficient land use policies including but no	ot limited to estimations of road lane miles, utility
niles, and land acreage necessary to facil	litate such policies;
(4) an analysis of sewer access and wa	ater access charges and policies;
(5) the estimated impact implementation	ion of efficient land use policies would have on
vehicle miles traveled, transit viability, ar	nd commute modal share in the metropolitan area;

(6) any other data or analyses the Met	ropolitan Council deems relevant.

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3.1	Subd. 4. Report. The Metropolitan Council must submit a copy of the study under this
3.2	section to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
3.3	jurisdiction over local government and transportation policy and finance by February 1,
3.4	<u>2025.</u>
3.5	Subd. 5. Appropriation. \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the general
3.6	fund to the Metropolitan Council to conduct the study under this section. This is a onetime
3.7	appropriation.
3.8	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective July 1, 2023.

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
