1.13 1.14	That the Senate recede from its amendment and that H. F. No. 3164 be further amended as follows:	
1.15	Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:	
1.16	"Section 1. [136F.302] CREDIT TRANSFER.	
1.17	The Board of Trustees must develop and maintain a systemwide effective and	
1.18	efficient mechanism for seamless student transfer between system institutions that has a	
1.19	goal of minimal loss of credits for transferring students. The Degree Audit and Reporting	
1.20	System (DARS) and u.select database (and successor databases) housed within the office	
1.21	of the chancellor shall be the official repository of course equivalencies between system	
1.22	colleges and universities. Each system college and university shall be responsible for	
1.23	ensuring the accuracy and completeness of course equivalencies listed for courses offered	
1.24	by that college or university. The development and maintenance of the system must, at a	
1.25	minimum, address the following:	
1.26	(1) alignment of institution curriculum and its communication to stakeholders;	
1.27	(2) transfer between similar programs;

2.5	faculty and students, a template to be used by the colleges and universities to ensure		
2.6	consistency in the information available to students. The links to each institution's		
2.7	informational Web site shall be submitted to the office of the chancellor for publication		
2.8	on the MinnesotaTransfer.org Web site;		
2.9	(5) training for campus-level staff to provide accurate and consistent advice to

2.11	(6) institutional rather than student obligation to provide prompt required

2.15	Sec. 2. REPORT OF CREDIT TRANSFER ACTIVITIES.		
2.16	The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities shall report		
2.17	on February 15, 2011, and annually thereafter through 2015, on its activities to achieve		
2.18	the credit transfer goals of Minnesota Statutes, section 136F.302, and the results of those		
2.19	activities. The report shall be made to the chairs and ranking minority members of the		
2.20	legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over higher education policy and finance.		
2.21	The goals of Minnesota Statutes, section 136F.302, should be fully achieved as soon as		

2.22 possible, but no later than the start of the 2015-2016 academic year."
