1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 375A.12, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.7	to read:
1.8	Subd. 7. Retention election on appointee. (a) At the first general election after the
1.9	effective date of this section, for any office made an appointed office after the effective date
1.10	of this section, the county must at the first general election following appointment hold an
1.11	election on whether to retain the person appointed. If the voters do not approve retention
1.12	of the person appointed to the position, the appointee may stay in the position only until
1.13	January 1 immediately following the election, at which time the county board of
1.14	commissioners must appoint another person to the position. If the voters approve retention
1.15	of the person appointed to the position, the county may retain the person and shall hold a
1.16	retention election at a general election every four years while the same person holds the
1.17	appointed office.
