Karlstad; Airport Runway 5.2 For a grant to the city of Karlstad for the 5.3 acquisition of land, predesign, design, 5.4 engineering, and construction of a primary 5.5 airport runway. This appropriation is for Phase 5.6 2 of the project and is in addition to the 5.7 appropriation for the same purposes in Laws 5.8 2021, First Special Session chapter 5, article 5.9 1, section 2, subdivision 2. 5.10 Sec. 3.
