(a) Each student shall be awarded a scholarship based on the 2.6 federal need analysis. Applicants are encouraged to apply for all other sources of financial 2.7 aid. The amount of the award must not exceed the applicant's cost of attendance, as defined 2.8 in subdivision 3, after deducting: 2.9 (1) the expected family contribution as calculated by the federal need analysis; 2.10 (2) the amount of a federal Pell Grant award for which the applicant is eligible; 2.11 (3) the amount of the state grant; 2.12 (4) the federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant; 2.13 (5) the sum of all institutional grants, scholarships, tuition waivers, and tuition remission 2.14 amounts; 2.15 (6) the sum of all Tribal scholarships; 2.16 2.17 (7) the amount of any other state and federal gift aid; and (8) the amount of any private grants or scholarships. 2.18 2.19 (b) The award shall be paid directly to the postsecondary institution where the student receives federal financial aid. 2.20 2.21 (c) Awards are limited as follows: (1) the maximum award for an undergraduate is \$4,000 \$8,000 per academic year; 2.22 (2) the maximum award for a graduate student is \$6,000 \$8,000 per academic year; and 2.23 (3) the minimum award for all students is \$100 per academic year. 2.24 (d) Scholarships may not be given to any Indian student for more than three years of 2.25 study for a two-year degree, certificate, or diploma program or five years of study for a 2.26

degree. Scholarships may not be given to any student for more than ten years including five

years of undergraduate study and five years of graduate study.

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(e) Scholarships may be given to an eligible student for four quarters, three semesters, or the equivalent during the course of a single fiscal year. In calculating the award amount, the office must use the same calculation it would for any other term.
