1.5	Section 1. APPROPRIATION.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Department of Education. The sum indicated in this section is
1.7	appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of education for the fiscal year
1.8	designated.
1.9	Subd. 2. Trauma-informed school incentive aid. (a) For grants to fund trauma-informed
1.10	and systematic professional development for all staff who work with students, including all
1.11	principals and administrators, to support students with adverse childhood experiences, and
1.12	to promote restorative practices and nonexclusionary discipline in schools:

1.14	(b) Eligible school sites will receive grant funds in the amount of \$75 times the number
1.15	of pupils enrolled at the site on October 1 of the previous fiscal year.
1.16	(c) The commissioner shall select schools to receive grant funds. Preference must be
1.17	given to schools within districts with large discipline disparities identified by the Department
1.18	of Human Rights.
1.19	(d) Trauma-informed support program plans and allocation of grant funds must be
1.20	negotiated by the school district and the exclusive representative of the teachers. Plans to
