1.10	not inimical to public safety and when the child has admitted the allegations contained in				
1.11	the petition before the judge or referee, or when a hearing has been held as provided for in				
1.12	section 260B.163 and the allegations contained in the petition have been duly proven but,				
1.13	in either case, before a finding of delinquency has been entered, the court may continue				
1.14	the case for a period not to exceed 90 180 days on any one order. Such a continuance may				
1.15	be extended for one additional successive period not to exceed 90 days and only after the				
1.16	court has reviewed the case and entered its order for an additional continuance without a
