1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 160.266, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 2. Creation. The commissioner, in cooperation with road and trail authorities
1.9	including the commissioner of natural resources, shall identify a bikeway that originates at
1.10	Itasca State Park in Clearwater, Beltrami, and Hubbard Counties, then generally parallels
1.11	the Mississippi River through the cities of Bemidji in Beltrami County, Grand Rapids in
1.12	Itasea County, Brainerd in Crow Wing County, Little Falls in Morrison County, Sauk
1.13	Rapids in Benton County, St. Cloud in Stearns County, Minneapolis in Hennepin County,
1.14	St. Paul in Ramsey County, Hastings in Dakota County, Red Wing in Goodhue County,

# (a) In lieu of a commissioners' hearing for award of damages under Minnesota Statutes, section 117.075, the commissioner of transportation is authorized to petition the court for a referral to the Office of Administrative Hearings. The court may refer the matter to the Office of Administrative Hearing only if all parties in the project, including condemnees, consent to the referral. Upon referral to the Office of Administrative Hearings by the court, an administrative law judge shall conduct a hearing for the purpose
