- Subd. 3a. Transportation policy plan; revisions; legislative approval. (a) By February 3.3 1, 2019, and at least every other odd-numbered year thereafter, the council must develop a 3.4 revised version of the transportation policy plan that meets the requirements of this section. 3.5 The council must submit each revised version of the plan to the members and staff of the 3.6 legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation policy and finance, and to the 3.7 Legislative Commission on Metropolitan Government. 3.8 (b) As part of the transportation policy plan revision process, the council must gather 3.9 3.10 and utilize input from the general public, including transportation stakeholders, community representatives, individuals having expertise in transportation and transit issues, and taxpayer 3.11 advocates. 3.12 (c) Any transportation policy plan revision does not take effect until the plan is approved 3.13 by law.
