Section 1. [144.4941] CRITERIA FOR STEMI RECEIVING CENTER DESIGNATION.

Subdivision 1. STEMI receiving center designation. (a) A hospital meets the criteria for a STEMI receiving center designation if the hospital has been accredited as a STEMI receiving center by the Society of Cardiovascular Patient Care, the Joint Commission, the American Heart Association, or another nationally recognized accreditation entity that provides STEMI receiving center accreditation. A hospital may apply to the Department of Health for designation as a STEMI receiving center by providing relevant and current documentation of STEMI receiving center accreditation by a nationally recognized accreditation entity.

- (b) The department may revoke a hospital's STEMI receiving center designation if it is determined that the hospital no longer has accreditation by a nationally recognized accreditation entity.
- (c) STEMI receiving center hospitals are encouraged to coordinate, through agreement, with STEMI referring hospitals throughout the state to provide appropriate access to care for STEMI patients.
- Subd. 2. **Designation.** A hospital that voluntarily meets the criteria for a STEMI receiving center may apply to the commissioner for STEMI receiving center designation and, upon the commissioner's review and approval of the application, shall be designated
