



2.1 a similar Minnesota license, but has not successfully completed all exams and human  
2.2 relations preparation components required by the Board of Teaching.

2.3 (d) The Board of Teaching, consistent with board rules, must issue up to three  
2.4 one-year temporary teaching licenses to an applicant who:

2.5 (1) successfully completed all exams and human relations preparation components  
2.6 required by the Board of Teaching; and

2.7 (2) holds or held an out-of-state teaching license to teach the same content field and  
2.8 grade levels, where the scope of the out-of-state license is no more than ~~one~~ two grade  
2.9 ~~level~~ levels less than a similar Minnesota license, but has not completed field-specific  
2.10 teaching methods or student teaching or equivalent experience.

2.11 The applicant may complete field-specific teaching methods and student teaching  
2.12 or equivalent experience by successfully participating in a one-year school district  
2.13 mentorship program consistent with board-adopted standards of effective practice and  
2.14 Minnesota graduation requirements.

2.15 (e) The Board of Teaching must issue a temporary teaching license for a term of  
2.16 up to three years only in the content field or grade levels specified in the out-of-state  
2.17 license to an applicant who:

2.18 (1) successfully completed all exams and human relations preparation components  
2.19 required by the Board of Teaching; and

2.20 (2) holds or held an out-of-state teaching license where the out-of-state license is  
2.21 more limited in the content field or grade levels than a similar Minnesota license.

2.22 (f) The Board of Teaching must not issue to an applicant more than three one-year  
2.23 temporary teaching licenses under this subdivision.

2.24 (g) The Board of Teaching must not issue a license under this subdivision if the  
2.25 applicant has not attained the additional degrees, credentials, or licenses required in a  
2.26 particular licensure field.

2.27 (h) The Board of Teaching must require an applicant for a teaching license or  
2.28 a temporary teaching license under this subdivision to pass a skills examination in  
2.29 reading, writing, and mathematics before the board issues the license. Consistent with  
2.30 section 122A.18, subdivision 2, paragraph (b), and notwithstanding other provisions of  
2.31 this subdivision, the board may issue up to two additional temporary, one-year teaching  
2.32 licenses to an otherwise qualified applicant who has not yet passed the skills exam.
