1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. MENDOTA HEIGHTS; OHEYAWAHE (PILOT KNOB).
1.6	Subdivision 1. Appropriation. \$1,027,000 is appropriated from the bond proceeds fund
1.7	to the Metropolitan Council for a grant to the city of Mendota Heights for Oheyawahe (Pilot
1.8	Knob), a culturally, historically, and environmentally important site and Dakota sacred site
1.9	located at 2100 Pilot Knob Road in Mendota Heights, overlooking the confluence of the
1.10	Mississippi and Minnesota Rivers, which is included on the National Register of Historic
1.11	Places. This appropriation includes money to predesign, design, and construct: multipurpose
1.12	gathering spaces, interpretation structures, trail connections and walkways, parking, and
