3.3	(2) the extent to which policies or practices of the political subdivision encourage and
3.4	promote complete streets planning, design, and construction;
3.5	(3) the extent to which the project supports connections between communities and to
3.6	key destinations within a community;
3.7	(4) identified barriers or deficiencies in the nonmotorized transportation system;
3.8	(5) identified safety or health benefits;
3.9	(6) geographic equity in project benefits, with an emphasis on communities that are
3.10	historically and currently underrepresented in local or regional planning; and
3.11	(7) the ability of a grantee to maintain the active transportation infrastructure following
3.12	project completion.
3.13	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.

3.15	\$ in fiscal year 2022 and \$ in fiscal year 2023 are transferred from the general
