1.5	Section 1. APPROPRIATION.
1.6	(a) \$ is appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2014, from the general
1.7	fund to the commissioner of human services for a grant to the Minnesota Office of Fetal
1.8	Alcohol Syndrome (MOFAS). Of the grant money dispersed by MOFAS, at least \$360,000
1.9	must be used to support nonprofit fetal alcohol syndrome outreach programs in Olmsted
1.10	County. Other grant recipients must be selected from communities which are not currently
1.11	served by federal Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant funds.
