## CHAPTER LXXIX.

An Act to Provide for the Organization of the County of March 4, 1872.

Case.

SECTION 1. Case county declared to be organized.

- 2. Appointment of commissioners by the governor-
- 3. Duties of county commissioners.
- 4. When act to take effect.

Bo it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the county of Cass is hereby declared

to be an organized county.

SEC 2. The governor of the state shall appoint three qualified electors of said county of Cass as commissioners of said county and the said commissioners shall as soon as may be after their appointment, meet and qualify and enter upon the duties of their offices, and they shall hold their offices until the next general election occurring more than thirty days after their qualification and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Commissioners to be appointed

Sec. 3. The said commissioners shall within six months from the commencement of their term of office by resolution concurred in by any two of them, locate the county seat of said county, and they shall also at their first meeting or at any meeting thereafter, appoint qualified persons to fill all the county offices in said county except as to such officers as may be rendered unnecessary in said county by reason of the attachment of the same to any other county for judicial purposes; which persons so appointed and having qualified shall hold their respective offices until the next general election, occurring more than thirty days after their appointment and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Duties of commissioners.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
