

CHAPTER CLVI.

An Act to Change the Name of Centerville, in Wabasha County, in the State of Minnesota, to Plainview, and Legalize Certain Conveyances Therein.

1872

SECTION 1. To change the name of Centerville to Plainview.

2. Conveyances of real estate heretofore made declared legal.

3. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the name of the village of Centerville, in the township of Plainview, in the county of Wabasha and state of Minnesota, be and the same is hereby changed to that of Plainview, by which name it shall hereafter be known, and in all transfers of real estate within the limits of said village made and acknowledged after the passage of this act, the same shall be described as being in the village of Plainview, and shall be as effectual to convey the title to such property as though the name of said village had never been changed, and no rights, privileges or immunities whatever shall be effected by such change of name.

SEC. 2. All conveyances of real estate within the limits of the surveyed plat of said village, as surveyed and platted by A. K. Bowen in the year A. D. 1856, heretofore made and executed, or that may be made and executed before the first day of next May, and heretofore or hereafter duly recorded in the proper records of said county, are hereby declared legal and sufficient to convey all the rights, title and interest the grantor or grantors had or may have at the time of such conveyance, in and to the property intended to be conveyed according to the intent and meaning of the instrument, whether the same is described as being in Centerville or in Plainview.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
