

## CHAPTER XL.

*An Act to Amend an Act entitled "An Act to Amend and Revise Chapter Thirty-one of the Special Laws of One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Eight, entitled an Act to Incorporate the Village of Waseca,"* February 29,  
1872.  
*Approved February 23, 1871.*

SECTION 1. Amendment to section 2 of chapter 4 of the Special Laws of 1871, relating to the boundaries of the town.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of chapter four (4) of the Special Laws of 1871, be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. All of the north half ( $n\frac{1}{2}$ ) of section seven-teen (17) and the north-east quarter ( $ne\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the east half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the north-west quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section eighteen (18) and the south half ( $s\frac{1}{2}$ ) of sections seven and eight (7 and 8) in township one hundred and seven (107) north, of range twenty-two (22) west, in Waseca county, in the state of Minnesota, shall be known as the village of Waseca, and by that name may sue and be sued, make contracts, purchase, take and hold, real and personal estate and property, and have a corporate seal, alterable at pleasure. Every grant and devise of lands, or right or transfer of property, which may have been, or may be made, for the benefit of its inhabitants, shall have the same effect as if made to the village by name.
