SEC. 4. That said person or persons so engaging in the raising, cultivating and propagating trout and other fish, shall post upon the said premises, in at least three conspicuous any for. places, durable signs, setting forth that such premises are devoted to the purposes of a fish pond, pound or preserve, and that thereafter any person or persons entering upon said premises without permission or authority, shall be deemed guilty of trespass, and upon conviction thereof, shall pay a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars for each offense, and in default of payment thereof, to be imprisoned to [in] the county jail not less than ten nor more than thirty day.

SEC. 5. Justices of the peace shall have jurisdiction to Jurisdiction of hear, try and determine all cases arising under this act, except peace.
