NUMBER XIII.

A JOINT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE SENATORS AND REPRESENTATIVES REPSESENTING MINNESOTA IN CONGRESS TO USE THEIR EFFORTS TO SECURE ADDITIONAL SERVICE ON MAIL ROUTE NUMBER TWENTY-SIX THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND FOURTEEN, FROM BENSON TO GLENWOOD.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That our senators and representatives in congress are requested to use their best efforts to secure additional service to tri-weekly trips on route Number twenty-six thousand three hundred and fourteen, from Benson to Glenwood.

Resolved, That the postmaster general is respectfully requested to place said tri-weekly service on the said route as soon as practicable.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in congress and the postmaster general.

NUMBER XIV.

A JOINT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE STATE TREASURER TO PRO-VIDE MEANS FOR THE PAYMENT OF AUDITOR'S WARRANTS DRAWN ON THE REVENUE FUND.

WHEREAS, There are not now sufficient money in the state treasury, to the credit of the revenue fund, for expenses of the legislature, for relief of destitute on the frontier, and other necessary purposes; therefore,

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to make arrangements with one or more of the national banks of St. Paul, whereby such bank or banks shall redeem state auditor's warrants to an amount not exceeding the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars, drawn on the revenue fund, and hold the same until such times as the accumulation of the said revenue fund shall be sufficient to redeem the same, in part or entire; and it shall be lawful for said treasurer to allow

and pay from receipts for interest on daily balances of state funds deposited under the provisions of chapter eleven of the general laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, such bank or banks interest at the rate of seven per cent. per annum, on daily sums or balances of such warrants so held, until such time as it shall be competent to pay such warrants or portions thereof from the revenue fund.

A JOINT RESOLUTION REQUESTING OUR SENATORS AND REPRESENTA-TIVES IN CONGRESS TO USE THEIR EFFORTS TO SECURE AN IN-CREASE OF MAIL SERVICE ON THE WORTHINGTON, LUVERNE AND SIOUX FALLS MAIL ROUTE.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That our senators and representatives in congress are requested to use their efforts to secure an increase of mail service on the Worthington and Luverne and Luverne and Sioux Falls mail routes.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in congress and to the postmaster general.

A JOINT RESOLUTION FOR A MAIL ROUTE FROM BENSON, IN SWIFT COUNTY, VIA APPLETON, IN SWIFT COUNTY, TO BROWN'S VALLEY, IN BIG STONE COUNTY.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That our representatives in congress be requested to use their efforts to secure the establishment of a mail route from Benson, in Swift county, via Appleton, in Swift county, to Brown's Valley, in Big Stone county.
