CHAPTER LXXVI.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 30, OF CHAPTER 10, OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF 1866, RELATING TO TOWN CAN-VASS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section 30, of chapter 10, of the general statutes of 1866, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 30. The canvass shall be conducted by taking a ballot

at a time from the ballot-box and counting until the number of ballots is equal to the number of names on the poll list, and if there are are any left in the box they shall be immediately destroyed, and the person having the greatest number of votes for any office shall be declared duly elected. *Provided*, that if two or more persons have an equal and the highest number of votes for any office, the judges of election shall at once publicly, by lot, determine who of such persons shall be declared elected. If on opening the ballots two or more ballots are found to be so folded that it is apparent that the same person voted them, the board shall destroy such votes immediately.

When act to take effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXVII.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF DEBTS OF INSANE PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Guardian to file inventory.

Section 1. That when a person has been or hereafter is appointed guardian of an insane person, said guardian shall within three months after the passage of this act, if already appointed, and within three months after his appointment, if hereafter appointed, make and file in the probate court by which the appointment is made, a schedule of all the property, real and personal, belonging to the estate of such insane person.
