

JOINT RESOLUTIONS.

NUMBER I.

A JOINT RESOLUTION TO CONGRESS ASKING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A POST ROUTE FROM FERGUS FALLS, MINNESOTA BY WAY OF ELIZABETH, COLBY, BARNESVILLE, GLYNDON, WILD RICE, SAND HILL, CROOKSTON AND FISHER'S LANDING TO GRAND FORKS, D. T. AND FROM BRECKENRIDGE TO GLYNDON.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Resolved, That our representatives and senators in congress be requested to use their influence to secure the establishment of a post route from Fergus Falls, by way of Elizabeth, Colby, Barnesville, Glyndon, Wild Rice, Sand Hill, Crookston and Fishers' Landing to Grand Forks, D. T. and from Breckenridge to Glyndon.

Resolved, That the postmaster general be requested to put service on said route as soon as said route shall be duly authorized by congress.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in congress, and to the postmaster general.

NUMBER II.

A JOINT RESOLUTION REQUESTING CONGRESS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO RELIEVE CERTAIN SETTLERS ON THE LINE OF THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD.

WHEREAS, Certain test suits are now pending in the United States court, to determine the rights and interests of certain settlers on lands within the limits of the Northern Pacific Railroad Grant; and

WHEREAS, The commissioner of the land department, has caused notice to be served on said settlers, that unless an additional \$1.25 per acre, is paid by said settlers within sixty days from date of said notice, their entries will be cancelled, thereby jeopardizing the interests as well as working a great hardship to said settlers; now therefore

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That the senators and representatives of this state in congress, be requested to use their influence in securing legislation, relieving said settlers from such additional payment, or to delay the proceedings of the land department until said suits shall have terminated.

Resolved further, That the governor be requested to forward copies hereof to our senators and representatives in congress, at the earliest practical day.

NUMBER III.

A JOINT RESOLUTION TO CONGRESS ASKING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A POST ROUTE FROM MOORHEAD, MINNESOTA, BY WAY OF GEORGETOWN, HAMER, SHELBY, NASHVILLE AND TWO RIVERS TO ST. VINCENT IN SAID STATE.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That our senators and representatives in congress be requested to use their influence to secure the establishment of a post route from Moorhead, Minnesota, by way of Georgetown, Hamer, Shelby, Nashville and Two Rivers, to St. Vincent, in said state.

Resolved, That the postmaster general be requested to put service on said route as soon as the route shall be duly authorized by act of congress.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in congress and to the postmaster general.
