

CHAPTER CXXXIV.

AN ACT IN RELATION TO THE ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A FERRY ACROSS THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER AT THE TOWN OF ANOKA, IN THE COUNTY OF ANOKA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the action heretofore had by the town of Anoka, in the county of Anoka, in the establishing and maintaining a ferry across the Mississippi river between said town of Anoka, and the town of Champlin in the county of Hennepin, be and the same is hereby in all things legalized and made valid.

SEC. 2. The said town of Anoka, is hereby authorized and empowered to maintain and operate said ferry where now established between said town of Anoka and Champlin, which the supervisors of said town of Anoka may select, and to that end and for that purpose may make and enforce such rules and regulations for the operating of said ferry as said town may think proper and necessary.

SEC. 3. The said town of Anoka shall at all times keep and maintain at said point a good and sufficient boat, with cable, towers and all the necessary apparatus to safely and successfully transport persons and property across said river, and shall cause said ferry to be run and operated at all hours and times, both day and night, and for that purpose a suitable person shall be in constant daily attendance from sunrise until eight o'clock P. M. that ferries are now by law required to be run and operated.

SEC. 4. The said town of Anoka may demand and receive toll for transporting persons and property across said river at said point, but shall neither demand nor receive a higher or larger rate of tolls than is hereinafter specified and allowed to-wit:

For every foot passenger each	five (5) cents.
For oxen, cows, mules, sheep, swine, each, . . .	five (5) cents.
For a man and horse	ten (10) cents.
For a horse and buggy,	fifteen (15) cents.
For a two ox team	fifteen (15) cents.
For each two horse team	fifteen (15) cents.
For each four horse team	thirty (30) cents.
For each four ox team	thirty (30) cents.
For each four mule team	thirty (30) cents.
For each six horse, or six mule team	forty (40) cents.

Subject however to revision by the legislature at any time.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
