CHAPTER 177.

An act to authorize the board of education of independent school behood districts. districts to issue bonds in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

May issue bonds in certain cases.

Section 1. That in all cases where the legal voters of any independent school district have within six months prior to this date, at a legally called meeting, by a majority vote, authorized the purchase of a site for and the construction and erection of a schoolhouse, or the improve-ment of any schoolhouse, and designated the sum so authorized to be expended, the board of education of such independent school district may issue the bonds of such district for the amount so designated, which bonds shall be signed by the president of such board of education and the clerk of the board of education. Such bonds shall be payable in such amounts and at such times, not exceeding fifteen years, as the board of education may direct, with interest not to exceed five per cent, and shall not be sold for less than their par value.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

CHAPTER 178.

H. F. No. 85.

An act to amend chapter fifteen of the general statutes of 1878, Care of the poor. in relation to county commissioners and the care of the poor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter fifteen of the general statutes of 1878 be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

Amending general statutes of 1878, chap. 15.

SEC. 2. Amend section five so as to read as follows:

Superintendents of poor.

Sec. 5. County commissioners to be superintendents of the poor.—The county commissioners shall by virtue of their office, be superintendents of the poor of their respective counties; and the commissioners of each county shall take charge of any poorhouse, farm, work-house, or other place provided for the accommodation, support or employment of the poor therein. Provided, that no member of any board of commissioners which is charged with the care of the poor under this act shall be either directly or indirectly interested in the furnishing of any supplies for the benefit of poor persons or in the erection or maintenance of any poorhouse, and no such member shall be a physician for the poor or overseer of the county poorhouse.
