Duties of county auditor and treasurer. thereof enforced in like manner as state and county taxes are collected in such county and in said state, and the payment thereof enforced. When such assessment shall have been collected, the amount thereof shall be paid by the county treasurer to the city treasurer of such city, and by said city treasurer be placed to the credit of the general fund of such city for the purpose of reimbursing said city for the cost of doing the work for which such assessment was made.

When assessment set aside park board to make new assessment, Sec. 5. If any such assessment shall be set aside as to any real estate for any cause, by a decision of court, or for any cause may be found irregular or defective, the said board of park commissioners may make a reassessment as to such property, from time to time, and as often as need be, until each lot or parcel of real estate has paid the cost of the cutting of the grass in front thereof, together with its proportionate part of the cost of making such assessment.

CHAPTER 174.

Inheritances by adopted children. An act to amend section 4477 of the General Statutes of 1894, being a part of the probate code, relating to inheritances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Sec. 4477, G. S. 1894, amended. SECTION 1. That section seventy (70) of chapter fortysix (46) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889), being section four thousand four hundred and seventy-seven (4477) of the General Statutes of one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour (1894) and being a part of the probate code, be and the same is hereby amended as follows, to-wit: there shall be and hereby is added thereto a provision, which shall be numbered eight (8), as follows:

Inheritance of adopted in event of death to go to heirs of parent by adoption. 8. Provided, however, that if any person dies, leaving an adopted child who receives any property from such deceased person by inheritance, or devise, or the proceeds of any life insurance policy on the life of said deceased, all such property and proceeds of said life insurance policy existing at the time of the death of such child, if said child shall die during its minority unmar-

ried and without issue, shall pass by inheritance to the heirs at law of the person from whom said child so received said property, or on whose life said life insurance policy was issued, to the exclusion of the natural heirs of said child.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 175.

An act to protect the public health by regulating the Public health, use of diseased, decaying and unwholesome animal matter.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use to any extent whatever, any part of an animal carcass use decayed not slaughtered when in good health or any butcher's meat of unoffal, as the same is herein defined, or any decaying or mal. unwholesome animal matter in the production or manufacture of any article of human food.

SEC. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to expose, Same, not to sell, or offer for sale, any part of any animal carcass be sold. not slaughtered when in good health, or any butcher's offal as the same is herein defined, or any decaying or unwholesome animal matter, or any article in which there shall have been used to any extent whatever any of such materials with the intent that the same may be used as human food, drink or medicine.

SEC. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to produce, Same, manumanufacture, or convert into any article of commerce, facture from by any process, any part of any animal carcass not matter. slaughtered when in good health, or any butcher's offal, as the same is herein defined, or any decaying or unwholesome animal matter, in any room wherein any article of human food is produced, manufactured or handled.

SEC. 4. Any person desiring to produce, manufacture Us. of for puror convert into any article of commerce, other than poses other human food, by any process, any part of any animal car-cass not slaughtered when in good health, or any butcher's offal, as the same is herein defined, or any decaying or unwholesome animal matter, shall apply to the state board of health for a license so to do.
