CHAPTER 314.

H. F. No. 251.

An act for the relief of Jane Ward, and to appropriate money therefor.

Relief of
Jane Ward.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one thousand (1,000) dollars be, and the same is hereby, appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the relief of Jane Ward, widow, for personal injuries sustained by her son and sole support, Ignatius Ward, while in the performance of his duties as a member of the National Guard of the State of Minnesota, from which injuries said Ignatius Ward died, October fourteenth (14), eighteen hundred and ninety-six (1896).

Provided, that the said Jane Ward shall receive, in lieu of all claims, ten (\$10) dollars per month, payable quarterly, as long as she remains single, or until the above one thousand (\$1,000) dollars shall have been paid to her.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 315.

An act to amend section fifteen (15) of chapter two (2) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred eighty-five (1885), as amended by chapter fifty-four (54) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred ninety-seven (1897), relating to the assessment and collection of taxes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section fifteen (15) of chapter two (2) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred eighty-five (1885), as amended by chapter fifty-four (54) of the General Laws of Minnesota, for the year eighteen hundred ninety-seven (1897), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:
