

CHAPTER 211—S. F. No. 481.

An Act to amend section 2953, Revised Laws, 1905, relating to bonds of trustees of cemetery associations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Trustees to give bonds not less than \$500.—Section 1. That section 2953, Revised Laws of 1905, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2953. Before entering upon his duties, each person chosen as a trustee of such fund shall give bond to the association in a sum not less than five hundred (500) dollars, and at least equal to one-third (1-3) the amount of the fund at that time, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his trust. Upon July 1 in each even numbered year every trustee shall give a new bond, in amount and with conditions as aforesaid. Every such bond shall be approved by a judge of the judicial district in which such cemetery or some part thereof is situate, and filed with the treasurer of the association. Failure by any trustee to renew his bond within thirty days after the time herein specified shall be a sufficient ground for his removal on application of any person interested.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 212—S. F. No. 559.

An Act to amend section five thousand one hundred and thirty-four (5134) of the Revised Laws, 1905, relating to divulging telegrams and telephone messages.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Divulging telegrams or telephone messages misdemeanor—penalty.—Section 1. That section five thousand one hundred and thirty-four (5134) of the Revised Laws, 1905, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 5134. Divulging telegram or telephone message. Every person who shall wrongfully obtain or attempt to obtain any knowledge of a telegraphic or telephonic message by connivance with a clerk, operator, messenger or
