

CHAPTER 397—H. F. No. 1174.

An Act giving unto certain townships containing platted portions and having 1,200 or more inhabitants residing on such platted portion, certain powers now possessed by villages of the fourth class.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Powers.—Section 1. Any township in this state having a platted portion on which there resides 1,200 or more people, shall have and possess the same power and the same authority now possessed by the villages of the fourth class under the laws of this state, insofar as such powers are enumerated in sub-division 7, 8, 9, 12 and 17, of section 727, Revised Laws of 1905.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 398—H. F. No. 1001.

An Act to amend section 5160 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Notice—redemption.—Section 1. That section 5160 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows, to-wit :

Any sheriff, constable, village marshal, police officer or any agent of the Minnesota or other societies for the prevention of cruelty, may remove, shelter, and care for any horse or other animal found exposed to the weather and not properly blanketed, or remaining more than one hour without attention in cold or inclement weather, or not properly fed and watered, or provided with suitable food and drink, and when necessary, may deliver such animal to another person to be so sheltered and cared for, and furnished with suitable food and drink; but in all cases the owner, if known, shall be immediately notified, and such officer, or the person having possession of the animal, shall have a lien thereon for its care and keeping and the reasonable value of the food and drink

furnished and the expenses of such notice. If the owner or custodian be unknown, and cannot by reasonable effort be ascertained, or shall not, within five days after notice redeem such animal by paying the expenses incurred as aforesaid, it may be treated as an estray, and be dealt with as such.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 399—H. F. No. 1011.

An Act authorizing the construction and maintenance of bridges across streams of water forming the boundary line of this state.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Construction of bridges.—Section 1. Counties, towns, cities and villages bordering upon streams of water which form the boundary line of this state may construct and maintain foot and wagon bridges across any such stream the same as if such stream was wholly within the limits of the county, town, city or village constructing the same; and any such local subdivision within which such bridge may be desired may singly or in conjunction with other such subdivisions unite in the construction and maintenance of said bridge with any one or more of the local subdivisions in the adjoining state or province into which any such bridge may extend; *provided*, that in such construction and maintenance the rights of adjoining states and provinces shall in no wise be infringed.

CHAPTER 400—H. F. No. 1024.

An Act to amend section 880, Revised Laws, 1905, relating to taxes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Collection of taxes.—Section 1. That section 880, Revised Laws, 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:
